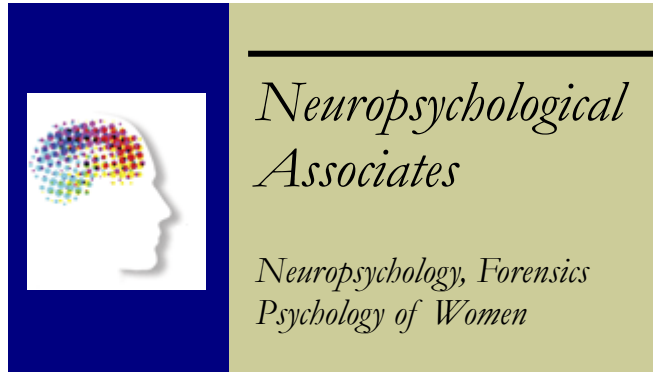

Frequently Asked Questions

How do I know if my memory problems are serious?

As we age, we will experience a natural decline in memory and cognitive functioning. However, if your memory problems consistently interfere with your daily life, then you may need an evaluation.

What are some signs that memory problems may be a concern?

A person with memory problems may: often repeat themselves or ask the same questions multiple times; have trouble managing finances and doing calculations; need constant reminders to do things like chores, shopping or taking medication.

Is there really something that can be done about memory loss and cognitive decline?

Yes. Progress in research has led to continuous advances in medication and other rehabilitative treatments. The important thing to consider is that the earlier we identify specific brain changes in an individual, the more options and benefits can be derived from treatment. Early detection of certain neurological disorders can lead to successful stabilization of the condition

What To Expect During Your Clinical Evaluation

- You and your family (if present) will meet with a clinician for an hour and he/she will conduct a thorough and comprehensive interview to gain an in-depth understanding of the problem.
- After the interview, we will administer a series of non-invasive cognitive tests to determine how your brain is working. The testing takes about two hours to complete.



Be Sure To Bring:

- Eye glasses and hearing aides
- MRI's or other brain scans
- Insurance cards
- List of medications
- Other pertinent medical records (lab work, etc.)
